Topeka Regional Airport Needs Local Fliers



Air service has arrived, but will only stay here if we use it. Last year travelers from the Topeka Metropolitan statistical area spent about \$127 million at the Kansas City International Airport.

"Topeka doesn't need to woo all of the local people who fly out of Kansas City, or even the majority" said Jack Penning with Sixel Consulting. "Seven percent would be wildly successful, seven percent would be a slam dunk."

The allure of the Topeka Regional Airport (airport code **FOE**) is convenience. In the time it takes to drive from Topeka to Kansas City, if you boarded a flight in Topeka you could be in Chicago. Fliers save an hour and a half by not driving to Kansas City Missouri. Travelers don't have to worry about catching a shuttle from the parking lot because they park directly across from the airport for the flat fee of \$5. Check out the [price comparison tool](#).

If service in Topeka is successful, United may decide to add more flights to Chicago or to start routes to Denver or Dallas, but first the capital city has to prove it has a sufficient customer base.

Oh Baby



Every baby deserves a healthy start, yet current statistics indicate that only about 80 percent of pregnant women in Shawnee County access adequate prenatal care. Annual births in Shawnee County average 2500, meaning that 500 babies are at risk for health problems and even death. Prenatal care reduces the likelihood of giving birth to a premature or low birth weight infant and infant death.

In Shawnee county eight or more infants per 1000 die within their first year of life. Preterm birth is the leading cause of long-term neurological disabilities in children

To address the infant mortality and low birth weight, Shawnee County healthcare agencies and social service partners formed the "Oh Baby" collaborative. Members include Baker University School of Nursing, Kansas Department of Children and Families, Kansas Department of Health and Environment, K-State Research and Extension, Lincoln Center Obstetrics and Gynecology, Shawnee County Health Agency, St. Francis Health Center, Stormont-Vail HealthCare, United Way of Greater Topeka and Washburn School of Nursing.



The Topeka Rescue Mission is developing a new plan to get the word out about train safety with the help of a grant from Union Pacific. "Union Pacific developed the grant program to empower communities to be active railroad safety participants," said Bob Grimaila, vice president of Safety, Security and Environment at Union Pacific. "[Topeka Rescue Mission] has taken the initiative to embrace railroad safety and care enough to ensure fellow community members understand how to be safe around railroad tracks."

Union Pacific announced in December that it had awarded grants to 21 public safety agencies and other groups across the country to education their communities about safety around trains. The Rescue Mission received \$5,000 for a program called Operation Safe TraX.
